- ❖ The Range Management Society of India (RMSI) is one of the earliest (1978) and reputed agricultural societies in India. It publishes *Range Management and Agroforestry* journal, an “A” category journal of NAAS/ICAR with NAAS rating of 6.40 (2026). It has organized several conferences in the past, a few worth mentioning are 3rd International Rangeland Congress in 1988, International Conference on Agroforestry for the Asia-Pacific region in 1994 and 23rd International Grassland Congress (IGC) in 2015 in New Delhi.

Conference Presentation Format

- ❖ Plenary Lectures: Internationally renowned scientists, policy makers and administrators will be invited to deliver special lectures on the topics related to the conference theme. They would present overview of the various symposia of the conference.
- ❖ Lead Lectures: These would offer an insight into the various conference sessions. Full length papers will be published in *Range Management and Agroforestry Journal*.
- ❖ Oral presentations: This would provide an opportunity for oral presentation of research papers received/submitted for oral/poster presentation. Eligible number of papers will be selected for presentation based on importance of subject matter and its relevance to the sub-themes of the conference.
- ❖ Poster presentations: The delegates will get an opportunity to present their contributory research papers through poster presentation. Poster presentation will be arranged session-wise. This would provide an opportunity to the participants to present their work in a more informal manner with personalized interaction with other participants.

- ❖ Full length papers will be invited from selected contributors for consideration for publication in Range Management and Agroforestry Journal.
- ❖ Exhibition, Advertisement and Sponsor presentations: Limited sponsor presentations will be arranged to provide an opportunity to sponsors to share their views and interaction with the delegates.

Themes & Sub-themes of Conference

i. Multifunctional Rangeland/Grassland

- Pasture, pastoralist and livestock integration.
- Grassland rejuvenation, biodiversity conservation and wild-life perspectives.
- Grasslands and climate change resilience, ecosystem services and their payment, restoration of degraded ecosystem for land degradation neutrality.

ii. Paradigm Shift in Forage Seed Research and Mechanization

- Forage seed research and innovations for improved pure and germinating seeds (PGS), seed quality and biotic and abiotic stresses.
- Novel approaches in forage seed production, propagation techniques, seed biology, seed storability, dormancy and viability management, participatory seed production etc.
- New vistas in mechanization for forage and seed production, processing, storage and value addition.

iii. Novel Approaches in Forage Crop Improvement

- Conventional and recent approaches for forage varietal development.
- Breeding for forage quality, stress resilience and bio-energy traits.
- PGR, CWRs, genetics and genomic resources, genomics assisted breeding, high throughput genotyping & phenotyping approaches, genome editing and apomixis.

iv. Forage Production and Natural Resources Management

- Forage based cropping systems, diversifications, integrated farming systems (IFS) for improved ecosystem services, and promoting circular economy.
- Agro-techniques for efficient resource use and One Health: PGPRs, precision farming, natural and organic farming, conservation agriculture and other nature based solutions.
- Non-conventional feed and fodder resources and forages for bio-energy.

v. Sustainable Livestock Production, Dairying and Value Chains

- Advances in animal breeding, feeding (designer feed & fodder, TMRs, VOCs based additives) disease management (disease diagnostics using biotech and sensors, forewarning and Decision Support System) and animal nutrition.
- Technologies for dairy processing and value addition, enhanced shelf-life and quality of livestock (milk and meat) and poultry products.
- Fodder conservation & post-harvest management (hay, silage, leaf meal, blocks, etc).

vi. Next Generation Technologies in Forages and Animal Sciences

- Use of artificial intelligence, drone and machine learning, data-driven modeling and forecasting, in fodder, pastures and livestock sector,
- Omics-technology for generating forage repository, DNA finger printing/ molecular markers tools for genetic purity testing in forages, biosensors, neo and synthetic compounds, next gen antimicrobials, etc.

vii. Alternate Land Use Systems and Agroforestry

- Forage based alternate land use system, especially horti-pastures, silvi-pastures, and multi-tier systems, etc.
- Tree-crop interactions and management, silvicultural techniques in agroforestry, genetic improvement in fodder trees, etc.

- Socio-economic perspectives of forages and forage based systems including pastoralists.
- Policy framework: grazing policy, financing, conflict resolution, land tenure rights and access for pastoral communities.

A special issue of Range Management and Agroforestry journal (impact factor 0.40) will be published from the conference papers. Best papers selected by the editorial board would get place in this special issue after a professional peer review process. Accommodation

The registration fee does not include accommodation charges. Limited accommodation is available in the government guest houses. The participants are encouraged to make their own arrangements for stay. A wide range of accommodation varying from 3-Star hotels to guest houses is available in the Jhansi city.

Guidelines for Poster Presentation

- For each session, there will be a poster session to encourage detailed discussion with presenters. The papers contributed for each poster session will have a convener. The convener will prepare and present summary of the poster session in the respective session. The posters are to be prepared in the standard form.
- Posters will be the principal format for the participant's volunteered presentations. Posters facilitate the exchange of experience and ideas. The posters will be grouped according to the sub-themes of the conference and a specific day, time and space will be allotted to each poster which will be indicated in the programmed for poster presentation. A good poster must be readable, legible, well organized and concise. For sake of uniformity, the following guidelines may be adhered for the preparation of paper.
- Poster preparation: The title card at the top should include in addition to title (in capitals), name(s) of the author(s) and their affiliation. The text of the poster may be divided into objective (two to three sentences), methodology, results (four pages including tables, charts/graphs) and summary/conclusions.
- Lettering: The lettering for the title should be 36 points in bold capital while that of name of authors in 28 point bold lower case and institution in 24 points bold italics lower case may be followed. All additional lettering should be 20 points normal. The heading namely, objectives, methodology, results and summary/conclusion should be in 20 points bold lower case.
- Script. Table and figure headings and text should be bold face lettering of 20 points. The numerals and letters included in the figures and tables should be 16 points normal.
- The size of the poster should not exceed 1.80 m (height) and 0.90 m width.
- Remember, a lot of people will read or study your poster while you are away, in such a case make sure that message is clear and simple.
- Posters will be evaluated by the Committee and for awards. Student's posters will be evaluated separately.

General Information

INSURANCE: The Organizing Committee assumes no liability for participants' personal accidents, sickness, and theft or property damage. Participants are requested to make their own arrangements with respect to health and travel insurance.

VISA: A valid VISA is necessary for all overseas delegates and all delegates are requested to apply at least 6 to 8 weeks before the proposed date of departure. For SAARC countries a permission authorization will be sent to the respective Indian consulate office in their country; however the individual delegate is required to apply for Indian visa, well in advance. Please consult your travel agency or nearest Indian Embassy/Consulate office.

LANGUAGE: The official language of the Congress will be English.

LETTER OF INVITATION: Individuals requiring an official letter of invitation in order to obtain a visa and authorization to attend the conference should contact the Organizing Committee. An invitation letter will be sent on request to registered delegates only. The letter of invitation does not financially obligate the Conference organizers in any way. All expenses incurred in relation to the Conference are the sole responsibility of the participant.

CURRENCY: The currency of India is Indian Rupee. One Rupee is divided into 100 paise. Rupee currency notes come in the denomination of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, and 500. Current exchange rate is US\$ 1=₹90.22/- 1 Euro = ₹105.33/- (approx).

BANKING AND EXCHANGE FACILITIES: Currency exchange facilities are available at banks and at hotels. Most banks are open from 10 am to 4 pm from Monday to Saturday; however some banks offer extended banking hours. 24 hours ATM is located in shopping centers and many neighborhood markets.

ELECTRICITY: In India electricity is provided at 220 V, 50 Hz. Sockets take round pins (2 or 3). Adapters are generally available at all hotels.

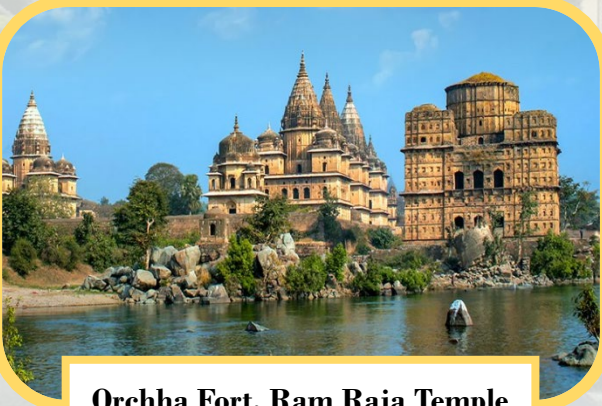

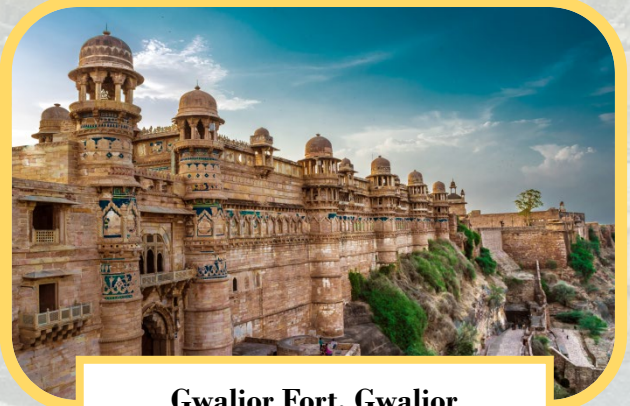

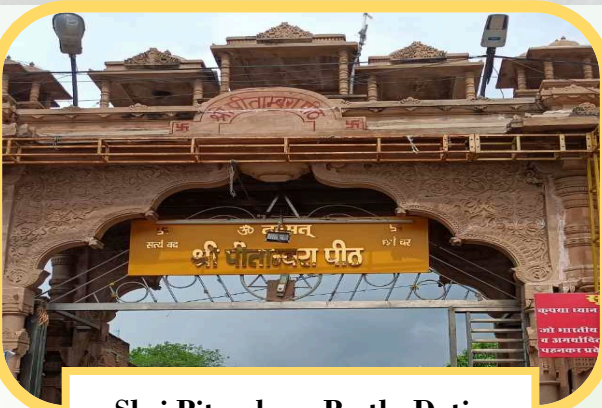

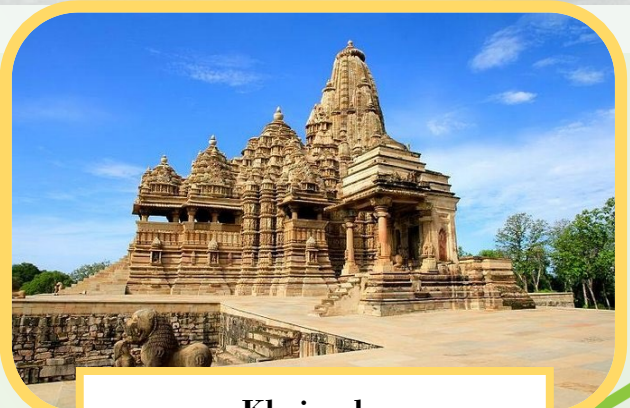
